## University of Houston Downtown Teacher Quality Leadership Project



The UHD-TQ Project for middle school mathematics teachers will begin Summer 2012 and extend through the following academic year to April 2013. Applicants must be full-time classroom teachers-of-record and teaching Grades 6, 7, or 8 mathematics.

Participants will benefit from fully paid instruction and support as follows.

During the summer:

- One 3-hour graduate credit in mathematics topics relevant for middle grades mathematics content and pedagogy offered at UHD July 9 – August 8, 2012, Mon – Thurs, 9am – 11am
- Training in how to use an I-Pad in the classroom together with a loaner I-Pad and appropriate classroom applications for the duration of the program
- Interaction with campus and grade-level peers to develop collaborative lessons for use in the classroom

During the academic year:

- One 3-hour graduate credit in education as activities learned during the summer are applied in teachers' classrooms throughout the year
- Attend 6 evening sessions at UHD to further develop middle school mathematics content
- Support from UHD faculty in applying concepts and skills learned during the summer
- Continued interaction with summer cohort collaborative teams

The grant will pay for:

- UHD tuition and fees
- Reimbursement of \$35 fee for application to UHD as a post-baccalaureate student
- Reimbursement for official transcripts required by UHD for this application
- Books, manipulatives related to coursework
- I-Pad on loan for the duration of the project. This will become the teacher's personal property upon completion of the entire program, or will be returned in working order to the project if unable to complete the entire program.
- Guest presenters
- Parking in the UHD visitors' lot
- Approximately \$600 stipend to help offset transportation/child care in order to attend the program that will be paid after the summer (\$350) and after the academic year (\$250) based on course completion of courses and attendance to scheduled course sessions.

#### To apply:

Submit application form for the UHD-TQ project no later than February 29, 2012. If intending to participate in the optional mentoring/leadership development, submit the additional 300-500 word essay, and letter of recommendation from Principal no later than March 15, 2012. Preferential selection will be based on cohorts of at least two teachers to facilitate collaborative teamwork within the same school.

Successful applicants will be notified by March 15, 2012 to expedite the application to UHD's postbaccalaureate program and to schedule pre-program classroom observations, as required by the federal Teacher Quality mandate.

## **Optional UHD Mentor/Leadership Development Program**

Mentor/leadership training will be offered at UHD on the same days as the TQ classes, 11:15am-12: 30pm.

Teachers who opt to participate in this training will be eligible for the following additional benefits and opportunities:

- CPE hours (22.5) in classroom management strategies, communication skills and mentoring /leadership skills
- On-campus opportunities to mentor beginning teachers, lead collaborative planning with grade level or vertical teams
- Serve as a mentor teacher for UHD undergraduate teacher candidates who are required to do 60 hours of classroom-based field-work for each of 2 semesters and 15 weeks of full-time student teaching. Stipends for this support are \$500 for each 60-hour semester and \$1000 for student teacher mentoring. This opportunity will be available on an as-needed basis for four academic years beginning Fall 2012 and ending Spring 2016.

In order to apply for the optional mentor/leadership component, please check the box on the TQ application (page 3) and have your Principal initial the application document allowing you to serve as a UHD mentor.

The following additional documents should be submitted with your application OR, if you need additional time, no later than March 15, 2012.

- A 300-500 word essay on why you wish to be a mentor/school-based leader
- A letter of recommendation from your Principal with respect to your potential to be a schoolbased leader and mentor.
